- 2. The receiving institution will send its decision within 4 weeks after the receipt of the complete application.
- 3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]

4. Termination of the agreement

In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."

5. Protection of personal data

The Institutions acknowledge and agree that they will share personal data in order to fulfill their obligations under this Agreement, in particular to facilitate the functioning of the Exchange.

The institutions recognize and agree that as far as personal data transmitted by one institution to another are concerned, each of the institutions is responsible for processing the processed data. Institutions are not co-responsible for treatment.

Each of the institutions undertakes, as far as it is concerned in the implementation of this Agreement, to respect the provisions of the General Data Protection Regulation N $^{\circ}$ 2016/679 (GDPR), in particular the following principles: purpose of the processing, proportionality and relevance of the processed data, limited retention period, security and confidentiality of the data, application of the rights of the persons (access, rectification, opposition for legitimate reason, limitation, portability and erasure).

The institutions also undertake to implement the necessary measures to prevent personal data from being damaged, erased or unauthorized third parties having access to it.

In the French university system, each course unit is graded on a scale from 0 to 20 points, 0 being the lowest grade and 20 the highest grade.

The pass mark thresholds are as follows:

10 < mark <12 Acceptable

12 < mark < 14 Satisfactory

14 < mark < 16 Good

16 < mark Excellent

ECTS credits:

1 full academic year = 60 credits

1 semester = 30 credits

1 trimester = 20 credits

3. Insurance

- European Health Insurance Card for medical assistance (just for people from the European Union's 28 Member States plus Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland) to access health care services during temporary visits abroad;
- Insurance Health for visitors outside European Union.
