The grading scale ranges from zero to ten (0 to 10) where, 0 is the lowest grade, 10 is the highest grade and five (5) is the minimum pass grade. The ranking is as following: **EXCELLENT-A** (8.5 to 10), **VERY GOOD-B** (6.5 to 8.49), **GOOD-C** (5 to 6.49) and **FAIL-F** (0 to 4.99).
