 - 4. Termination of the agreement

[In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."]

In case of termination a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September of one academic year will only take effect as of 1 September of the following academic year. The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."

1. Grading systems of the institutions

At I MILANOO2: The European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) is fully implemented. Credits measure the student workload which is required to pass the examination and include class attendance, classwork, laboratory work and individual study. It is also possible to obtain credits for other training courses, project works or theses, internships, basic computing skills, training in communication and public relations and group work.

One credit corresponds to a workload of about 25 hours and the yearly workload for an average study course corresponds to about 50 credits. Each subject is assigned a number of credits which the students obtains when they pass their final examination. Exams are graded using a grading scale of 30, where 18 is the minimum passing grade and 30 cum laude the highest.

2. Visa

The sending and receiving institutions will provide assistance, when required, in securing visas for incoming and outbound mobile participants, according to the requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education.
