



SWISS-EUROPEAN MOBILITY PROGRAMME SEMP INTER-INSTITUTIONAL AGREEMENT

valid 2022 - 2027,

between BFH Bern University of Applied Sciences and Nova School of Science & Technology

The institutions agree to cooperate for the exchange of students and/or staff in the context of the Swiss-European Mobility Programme SEMP. They commit to respect the quality requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education (ECHE) in all aspects related to the organisation and management of the mobility, with the supplement that SEMP promotes both, outgoing mobility to programme destinations, as well as incoming mobility from these countries to Switzerland, financially.

Should the current status of Switzerland, or of the respective partner change, with regard to the Erasmus+/follow-up programme, the regulations will be adjusted, and the partners informed in due time.

The Bern University of Applied Sciences (BFH) intends to implement Erasmus Without Paper (EWP) in the near future. As soon as EWP is put in place, the administration of the mobility, defined in this agreement, will be specified digitally on the Erasmus+ Dashboard.

The BFH is currently developing a comprehensive strategy for reducing its CO2 emissions caused by business travels and study trips, without compromising international cooperation and educational mobility and supports such intentions from its partner institutions.

Are there any admission requirements for exchange students?

For undergraduate (Bachelor) students an exchange is **not allowed** prior to the **third semester of study**.

Language requirements:

Most of our undergraduate (Bachelor) courses are taught in German (Level B2-C2 required). Our graduate (Master) courses are taught in English or German (basic German knowledge favorable).

Scholarship

During the indirect participation at Erasmus+, through the Swiss-European Mobility Programme (SEMP), a scholarship is available for outgoing AND Incoming SEMP students.

Accommodation

Does BFH offer housing for incoming exchange students? If so, what kind of housing is it?

BFH Bern University of Applied Sciences has no central campus and therefore no central oncampus student housing.

There is a limited number of non-campus accommodation (rooms in dormitories with shared facilities) at the School of Agriculture in Zollikofen and the Institute of Sports in Magglingen. The international coordinators of the relevant departments can help arrange accommodation for exchange students there (for contacts see page1 of this document).

The International Offices provide support to all exchange students in finding accommodation according to local standards. A broad level of different housing opportunities exists. Commonly, students rent a room in off-campus student or private apartments.

How much is the accommodation fee?

Accommodation costs about CHF 450-750 per month. The living costs for students per month are approximately between CHF 1'500 and CHF 2'400 (including accommodation).

Do students need to apply for housing?

Yes, students need to apply for housing themselves, by using the online search tools provided below. Support can be requested from the International Office of the respective department, if necessary.

For SEMP exchange students (Swiss-European Mobility Programme) tuition fees are waived.

Others

Does BFH require insurance for all international students?

No. However, in Switzerland health insurance for stays of longer than three months is compulsory. A basic insurance plan covers medical care in case of sickness or accident.

Students are responsible for taking out health insurance themselves. After arriving in Switzerland and registering with their municipality of residence, they have three months to take out health insurance. Provided they register within this time, they are insured from the time they enter Switzerland. The students are free to choose the health insurance fund they wish. Some insurance companies provide special offers for students. However, special provisions apply to persons who are staying in Switzerland for the purpose of basic/continuing education and training, depending on their situation.
