- A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.
- 3. CY NICOSIA01: A Transcript of Records will be issued by the University of Cyprus no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.
- 4. Termination of the agreement

In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year shall be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agency can be held responsible in case of a conflict.
