Transcripts of Records: A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than five weeks after the assessment period has finished.

Termination of Agreement: A unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 November 20XX will only take effect as on 1st September 20XX+1. Neither the European Commission or the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict

2. The receiving institution will send its decision within [4] weeks (minimum).
3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than [5] weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]
4. Termination of the agreement

This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1.
